- Trial Lawyer
 - Avoiding harmful evidence
 - Fishing for opposing theories
 - Educating the Court
 - Creating contrast in style

Appellate Lawyer


- Prepare with trial counsel
- Assume "law role" for trial court
- Free up trial counsel



Proposed Jury Charge

Drafts early and often

- Never too early to start
- Work together leading to trial
- What can we win?
- What do we have to have?
- Negotiate specific wording



Trial Roles

- Appellate Lawyer
 - Covering elements?
 - Evidence admitted?
 - Reviewing PowerPoints
 - Reminders
 - Objections
 - Additional questions



Trial Roles

- Keep the jury engaged
 - Opening props
 - Direct vs Cross
 - Objections
 - Experts
 - Always watching
- Arguments outside presence
- Error Preservation



Informal Charge Conference

- Be prepared early
- · Work with the other side
- Formal charge conference can be too late to persuade
- Update trial counsel with changes
 - Negotiated changes
 - Rulings

- Be prepared
- Preserving error
- Responding to objections
- Take your time
- Phase Two Charge?
